1 Roll Call

Mayor Mike Gamba called the meeting to order at 4:00 pm. Present: Stephen Bershenyi, Todd Leahy, Steve Davis, and Kathryn Trauger. Absent: Matt Steckler and Leo McKinney

Also present were Drew Gorgey, Acting City Manager; Karl Hanlon, City Attorney; Catherine Mythen Fletcher, City Clerk; Terry Wilson, Police Chief; and Christina Brusig, Center for the Arts Director.

2 Pledge of Allegiance

Mayor Gamba led in the Pledge of Allegiance.

3 Protest/Appeal of a Special Event Liquor License for Glenwood Arts Council Wild West Fermentation Fest

Karl Hanlon stated the person protesting this license will not be at this hearing.

Catherine Mythen, City Clerk, explained the Special Event Liquor License process; noted the public notice error due to the applicant using the wrong event address on the application; reviewed the hearing and Ms. Suerth's concerns.

There were no public comments.

Christina Brusig, Executive Director of the Glenwood Springs Arts Council, stated Ms. Suerth was concerned about bridge construction, but there will be none July 1st through the 4th. The Arts Center lawyer has also been working with Ms. Suerth.

Emily Arredondo, Roaring Fork Events, summarized her experience as an Event Coordinator and addressed each of Ms. Suerth's protests. She continued with a description of the event and the site plan.

Chief Wilson commented this is a new event so there will be complaints and the City Manager will need to waive the noise ordinance. Whenever there is music someone will complain about it. It's an over 21 event with well controlled access. This will be a busy weekend throughout town.

Drew Gorgey explained there were several meetings with Staff and the applicants to address public safety, security, liquor licensing and parking.

Councilor Leahy moved, seconded by Councilor Bershenyi, to uphold the approval of the Special Event Liquor License regarding the Arts Council's Wild West Fermentation Fest.

The motion passed by those present.

4 Special Event License Agreement for Glenwood Springs Arts Council Wild West Fermentation Fest for use of City Owned Facilities

Karl Hanlon noted Council has seen this Agreement, but a damage deposit has been added.

Councilor Trauger moved, seconded by Councilor Leahy, to approve the Special Event License Agreement for Glenwood Springs Arts Council Wild West Fermentation Fest for use of City Owned Facilities.
