Open Houses Scheduled for Nov. 29 and 30 for “Glenwood: Moving Forward Together” Project City Invites Community to Learn about the U.S. EPA Brownfields Area-Wide Planning Effort

GLENWOOD SPRINGS, Colo. – The City of Glenwood Springs is excited to announce that the “Glenwood: Moving Forward Together” Project – the U.S. EPA Brownfields Area-Wide Planning Effort is underway, and wants community members to stay engaged and provide their voice.

The Glenwood Community is invited to a series of two open houses – on Nov. 29 and 30 – to learn more about the project and to help guide the strategy to tie together the Confluence Redevelopment, 6th Street Corridor Master Plan, 7th Street Beautification project and Two Rivers Park. Residents will be given an opportunity to help shape the project by identifying their priorities for moving forward and helping to refine the recommendations made in past plans.

Both open houses will run from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. at the Glenwood Springs Branch Library. The two events will provide the same information and opportunity to provide feedback. Community members are encouraged to attend the event that is convenient for them.

The “Glenwood: Moving Forward Together Project” is a U.S. EPA Brownfields Area-Wide Planning Effort made possible by a grant to revitalize several brownfield sites located along the Colorado and Roaring Fork Rivers in the City’s core.

“This effort will result in an implementation plan for areas at the confluence of the Colorado and Roaring Fork rivers and other key sites in the heart of Glenwood Springs,” City Manager Debra Figueroa said. “We are looking forward to community input on this project as we connect past efforts into a strategy for the future.”
