



MEETING NOTES

Members of the River Commission in attendance included Erika Gibson, Brendon Langenhuizen, Chairman Ashley Moffatt, Elise Osenga, Vice Chairman Scott Schreiber, and Chris Treese. Ryan Davis and Sarah Gordon were absent. Kyle Holt (Roaring Fork Fishing Guide Alliance), Chad Rudow (Roaring Fork Conservancy), Jenn Ooton (Assistant City Manager), and Trent L. Hyatt (Senior Planner/River Commission Staff Liaison) were also present.

Receipt of the Minutes

Commissioner Gibson made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Osenga, to approve the minutes from the January 8, 2020 meeting. The motion passed unanimously.

2020 Goals and Priorities

The group reviewed the updated goal/action items list and provided additional revisions/additions related to monitoring of the proposed Rocky Mountain Resources quarry expansion, involvement in future confluence redevelopment discussions, and the various commissioners responsible for each task. Chairman Moffatt moved to adopt the document as amended, seconded by Vice Chairman Schreiber. The motion passed unanimously.

Sub-Committee Updates

Riparian Setback - Mr. Hyatt explained the he planned to recommend a 35-foot setback from the ordinary high-water mark with an allowable 10 percent disturbance area to the Planning and Zoning Commission at their February 25 meeting. He explained that his recommendation is based on the mapping evaluations by High County Engineering and SGM.

Two Rivers Park Shoreline Restoration – The group had questions related to landscaping for the improvements and the scheduling of a field trip to the construction site.

Commissioner Gibson recommended a discussion regarding speaker series topics at the next meeting.
